(“CTH”) is committed to the protection of personal information in terms of the Protection of Personal Information Act 4 of 2013 (“POPIA”) and any applicable and/or related international legislation. As a legal practice and holder of a valid Fidelity Fund Certificate, we are obliged to follow legislative requirements to collect personal information from you in so far as it relates to the rendering of legal services. We are governed by the Rules and Regulations of the Legal Practice Council and the Legal Practitioners Act.

This privacy notice provides details of the personal information we collect from you, what we do with it, how you might access it and who it might be shared with.

Purpose of processing your personal information:

We use your personal information only for the purpose for which it is collected. Our offices may collect, hold, use and/or disclose your personal information mainly to execute the legal services we are mandated to provide to you and in relation to matters associated thereto.

We will only process your information for such a purpose which you would reasonably expect, including but not limited to:

- a) Verify your identity;
- b) To provide you with legal advice;
- c) Comply with any obligations associated with the mandate provided by you to our firm and its attorneys;
- d) Comply with any other legal and/or regulatory requirements where applicable; and
- e) Confirm, verify, and update your details.

We may also use your personal information for other similar associated activities, including marketing and communications, but that will only occur in the case where we have your consent or another lawful justification for doing so.

What personal information do we collect?

We only collect the minimum amount of information that is relevant to the purpose. Information that we hold might include but is not limited to your first and last name; e-mail address; physical or postal address; other contact information; date of birth; qualification; family history; gender; assets; investments; insurance; residency; occupation; income; liability; title; past and present employment; banking details; medical information; and expenditure.

Failure to provide compulsory information may lead to our organisation's inability to render services to you. If there is any specific personal information to collect, we will indicate as such, at or near the time of collection.

If you interact with us on the internet, the personal information we collect depends on whether you just visit our website or, use our services. If you visit our website, your browser transmits some data automatically, such as your browsing times, the data transmitted and your IP address.

If you use our services, personal information is required to fulfill the requirements of that service.

Source of collection of your personal information

Our offices may collect personal information from the following data subjects:

- a) You (the client)
 - By way of a signed letter of engagement and/or mandate with CTH and the information provided therein;
 - Relevant FICA documentation;
 - Information provided by you during consultation with a representative from our offices;
 - Through other documentation provided by you;
 - Through information disclosed in legal documents (pleadings/affidavits, etc.); and/or
 - External sources such as social media
- b) Searchworks
- c) nCino
- d) Tracing Agents
- e) Credit Bureaus

How do we look after personal information?

We limit the amount of personal information collected to only what is fit for the purposes as described above. We restrict, secure and control all of our information assets against unauthorized access, damage, loss, or destruction; whether physical or electronic. We retain personal information only for as long as is described above, to respond to your requests, or longer if required by law. If we retain your personal information for historical or statistical purposes, we ensure that the personal information cannot be used further. While in our possession, together with your assistance, we try to maintain the accuracy of your personal information.

Third parties and your personal information

Our offices may have to share some of your information to third parties, to enable us to provide legal advice and/or services to you that you have requested and/or in relation to matters associated thereto. Where we might share your information, we will take precautions to ensure that such third parties will treat your information with the same level of protection as required by our offices.

How can you access your personal information?

You have the right to request access to any of your personal information we may hold. If any of that information is incorrect, you may request that we correct it. If we are improperly using your information, you may request that we stop using it or even delete it completely.

If you would like to make a request to see what personal information of yours that we might hold, you may make a request from our organisation as per the details above.

Where you have previously given your consent to process your personal information, you also have the right to request that we transmit your personal information to a different service provider.

Where it may have been necessary to get your consent to use your personal information, at any moment, you have the right to withdraw that consent. If you withdraw your consent, we will cease using your personal information without affecting the lawfulness of processing based on consent before your withdrawal.

Complaints and objections

As a data subject, you have the right to:

- Request that we confirm whether or not we hold personal information regarding yourself;

- Request that we provide you with a description of the personal information we hold about you and explain why and how it will be processed;
- Request that we consider your objections to the processing of your personal information; and/or
- Lodge a complaint with the Information Regulator.
